Contractor chosen for Christ Cathedral reconstruction

The iconic glass sanctuary built by the late Rev. Robert H. Schuller is a step closer to morphing into a Roman Catholic cathedral — one the county's Catholics hope will stand as a beacon for the faithful around the country.

On Tuesday, the Most Rev.

Kevin Vann, bishop of the Diocese of Orange, was to sign a contract with Irvine-based construction firm Snyder Langston, which will take on the cathedral's massive reconstruction project that is expected to cost about \$72.3 million. The construction company's contract is valued at about \$45 million.

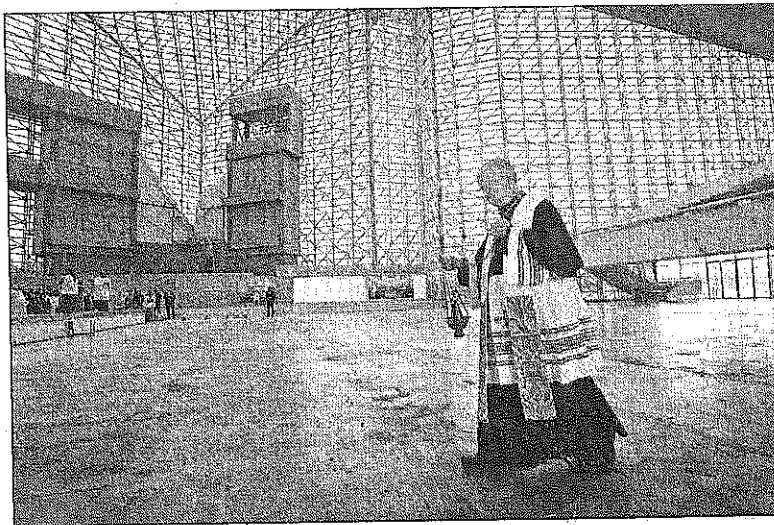
The signing ceremony inside the sanctuary was to be followed

by a carillon concert and Eucharist procession.

Construction on the project is set to begin June 1, said John Rochford, Snyder Langston's president and chief operating officer.

"It is truly prestigious for an Orange County construction firm like us to have an opportunity to build a cathedral in our backyard," he said. "You build hotels

and resorts, but nothing matches building a cathedral. It would be quite an achievement for us."

Rochford said he is a practicing Catholic, as are many members of his firm, which makes the project even more special for them.

The project would employ subcontractors and hundreds of workers including masons, carpenters and electricians, he said. The biggest challenge, Rochford said, is to ensure worker safety as they operate high above the ground, installing everything from the ceiling and air conditioning to lights and other fixtures.

The sanctuary's ceiling is at a height of 127 feet, which means it's taller than a 12-story building.

"When you're working at that height for a long period of time, things can get complicated," Rochford said. "That's why we are making sure we have a comprehensive safety plan and working with subcontractors to ensure all workers are properly trained for the job."

When the sanctuary is ready for dedication by early 2019, it will be bathed in white and air-conditioned for comfort, and the entire floor will be covered with travertine tiles, said Richard Heim, special adviser

on the construction project.

In September, the diocese unveiled a design plan for the sanctuary's transformation into a Catholic worship space, with white as the dominant color, a lighted altar in the center, the bishop's chair, a baptismal font and shrines for Our Lady of Guadalupe and Our Lady of La Vang, a Marian apparition believed to have blessed persecuted Catholics in Vietnam at the turn of the 19th century.

The refurbished Hazel Wright organ is being stored in a warehouse and will be installed once construction is completed.

The Orange Catholic Foundation, the diocese's

fundraising arm, launched a campaign in 2012 titled "For Christ Forever Capital Campaign" to raise money for the renovation. The \$72.3 million price tag was significantly trimmed from more than \$100 million under Vann's direction.

Heim said Snyder Langston was chosen because of its reputation in the construction industry and the firm's strong relationships with subcontractors.

The excitement over the cathedral in the community is palpable, Heim said.

"The diocese is now moving ahead with the centerpiece of its investment in Orange County," he said. "It's going to be a unique cathedral."

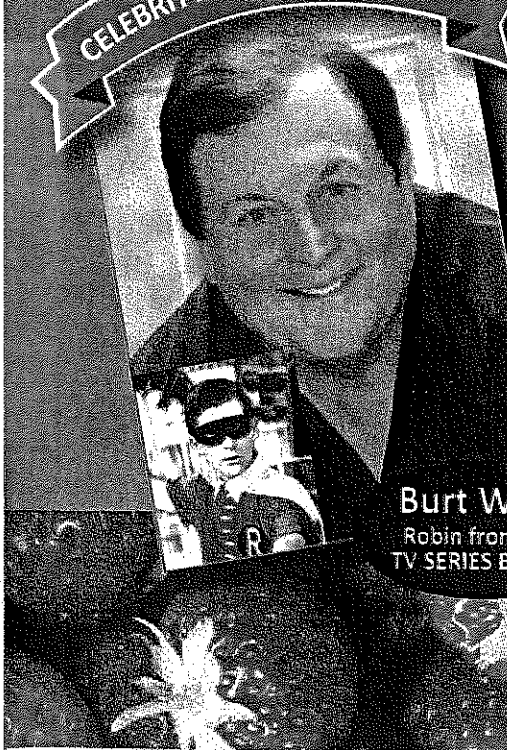

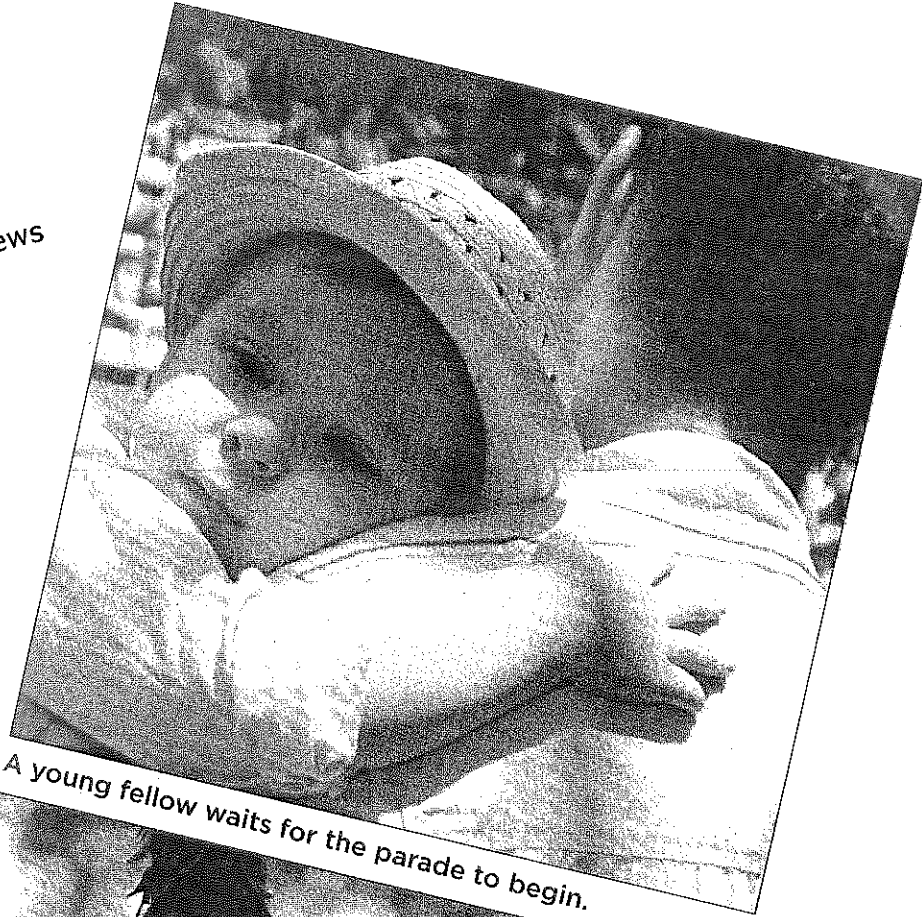

It was a different time. Folks were less enlightened and less sensitive. Mr. Barty, 3-feet-9, must have been pretty sick of the constant chuckles behind his back, and the inane questions to his face.

He was a proud man. I got the feeling he just wanted to be treated like a man, nothing more, nothing less.

He once said, "The general public thinks all little people are in circuses or sideshows. We have doctors, nurses, just about every field covered."

Amen.

On that day, he was quick-tempered. Also, at times, witty and mischevious. He carried out his duties, endured some bullying and managed to make many children smile.

God bless Mr. Barty. May he rest in peace.

That was my first brush with celebrity at the annual festival.

My second came a short while later.

Ed Arnold, most known as a sportscaster and newsman for KABC, KTLA and KOCE, was the celebrity grand marshal. I had the pleasure of speaking with him. I'll describe him in five ways:

- 1) Polite;
- 2) Easygoing;
- 3) Humble;
- 4) Professional;
- 5) Great voice, great cadence.

It was like watching Channel 5. I wanted to sit back with a cold glass of lemonade and listen to the broadcast.

My third has not exactly happened, unless you count Facebook messages. But I expect to make it happen by phone either today (Wednesday, May 24) or tomorrow.

Burt Ward is this year's celebrity grand marshal.

Freaking Robin.

The original! The one I watched as a kid!

He couldn't have been nicer via text. He spends a lot of time helping dogs through his organization, called Gentle Giants. He's done a lot since "Batman," but he'll always be Robin to me.

Am I starstruck?

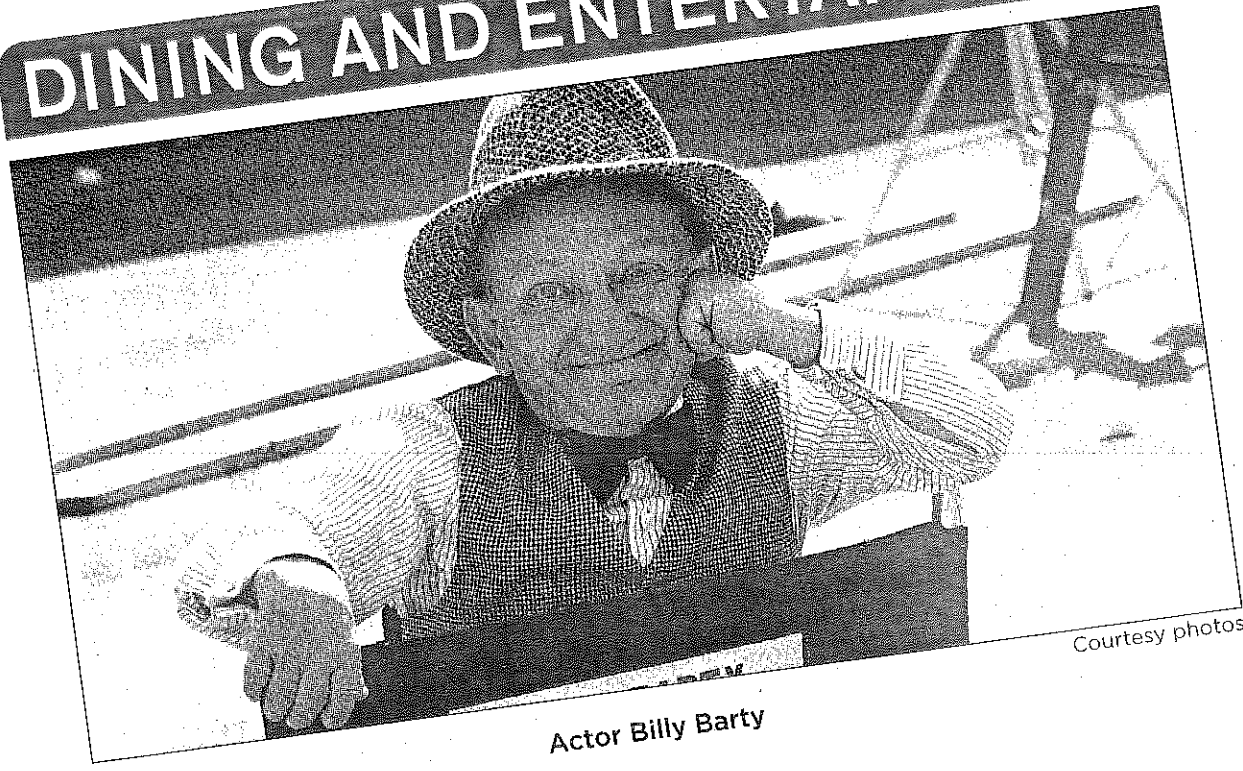
Oomph!

When I get him on the horn, let's hope I don't de-evolve into that 8-year-old boy in a batsuit.

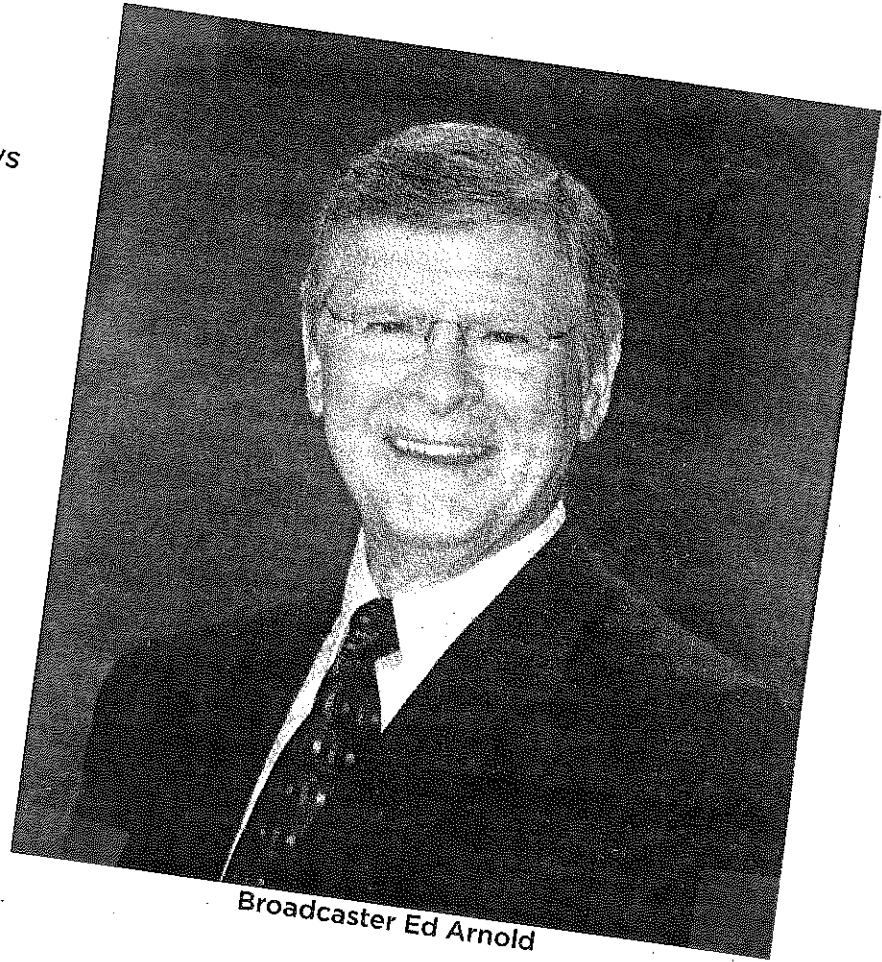

Police issue 131 tickets for unsafe driving

Crosswalk operation intended to make drivers more aware

As part of Garden Grove's Accident Reduction Campaign, the Garden Grove Police Department conducted a crosswalk operation on May 12, at Lemonwood Lane and Garden Grove Boulevard.

The purpose of the operation was to educate drivers on the importance of yielding to pedestrians in marked and unmarked crosswalks. The operation was funded by the California Office of Traffic Safety.

Drivers who did not yield the right of way to a Garden Grove police cadet crossing in a crosswalk, wearing a reflective safety vest, were ticketed. The crosswalk operation resulted in 131 citations issued.

Fluorescent signs at the crosswalk and 300 feet prior, give

drivers advanced warning of the upcoming marked crosswalk.

Officer Kathy Anderson, a member of the Accident Reduction Team, stated, "This enforcement operation was conducted after National Distracted Driving Awareness Month in April, where we saw a lot of drivers not paying attention to the road or their surroundings. We are out there with the primary purpose to help raise awareness and to prevent fatal accidents."

The city's Accident Reduction Team, composed of Garden Grove Police Department's motorcycle officers, is asking Garden Grove drivers to slow down and keep an eye out for pedestrians. The Accident Reduction Team reaches out to commuters through various media outlets, as well as through community meetings and presentations to educate the public

on the dangers of not following traffic laws.

'These students are heroes'

Santiago freshmen honored for saving schoolmate's life

Three freshman students from Santiago High School were honored by the Garden Grove Fire Department during an assembly earlier this week for saving a classmate from drowning.

Garden Grove Fire Chief Tom Schultz awarded freshmen Angelo Mendoza, Daniel Gomez, and Cristina Contreras with the Fire Chiefs Coin, a special accolade, usually reserved for firefighters.

It is the highest honor for life-saving actions.

Chief Schultz praised the students for their quick actions,

which saved the life of Christopher Tran, who sank to the bottom of the deep end of the school pool on April 28.

The students rescued Tran from the bottom of the pool and carried him to safety out of the pool. Garden Grove Fire Department paramedics Dave Carlson and Grant Noble responded and Tran successfully recovered at an area hospital with no lasting injuries.

The students were honored in front of their classmates and parents at Santiago High School.

Also in attendance were Garden Grove Mayor Steve Jones, Santiago graduate and Garden Grove Councilman Kim Nguyen, and the Garden Grove Fire Department paramedics who responded to the near-drowning.

The City Council will honor the students during the city's Community Spotlight section of the council meeting next month.

"We are so proud that our students were able to think and act quickly in a split second to prevent what could have been a tragic drowning," said Walter Muneton, Garden Grove Unified School District Board of Education trustee. "These students are heroes; they knew just how important it was to help and in that instance, they help saved a life."

OCTA board approves OC Streetcar funding

**\$148 million is
sought from

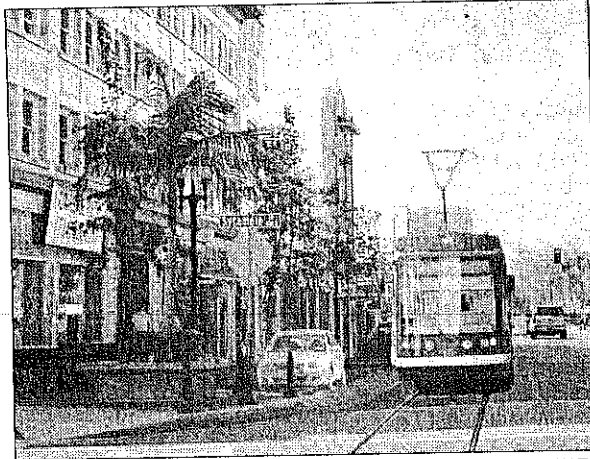
ORANGE » The Orange County Transportation Authority board on Monday approved a full-funding agreement with the Federal Transit Administration for the OC Streetcar project that it expects feds will grant.

Under the grant agreement, which passed on an 11-0 board vote, OCTA is trying to secure up to \$148.9 million in federal New Starts program funds, which would cover nearly half of the streetcar's total cost. Of the remaining tab, 19 percent will come from Measure M, the county's half-cent tax for transportation improvements, and the rest through other, already committed federal and state cap-and-trade funds.

Staff had been working toward Monday's approval for years. OCTA board member Miguel Pulido called it "the biggest single step so far" for the streetcar planned on a 4.1-mile route from the Santa Ana Regional Transportation center to a new multimodal transit hub on Harbor Boulevard in Garden Grove.

"The next one will be later this year when the federal government enters into a full-funding agreement and starts sending us the money. At that point we break ground," said Pulido, who is mayor of Santa Ana. "This has never happened in Orange County, not even close. This is wonderful."

OCTA board members on Monday also authorized the use of an addi-

tional \$1.4 million in Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program funds, a 0.48 percent increase from the previous approved base cost, for a new streetcar project total of \$299.3 million.

The FTA requested the increase based on a risk assessment it conducted, said Jim Beil, OCTA's executive director of capital programs. While some project areas saw reductions, the cost to design the streetcar and procure new vehicles jumped.

"I just would hope we don't lose the forest in the trees when we look at this project," OCTA board member Tim Shaw said. "This is a huge example of leveraging our money, but getting significant outside resources from the state and the federal government to build this project."

OCTA plans to submit final documents supporting the full-funding grant agreement application to the FTA late this month. Following FTA approval and a 30-day congressional review, the agreement could be finalized by early December.

OCTA worked diligently, made deadlines and was graded well by the FTA, said Sherry Little, a mem-

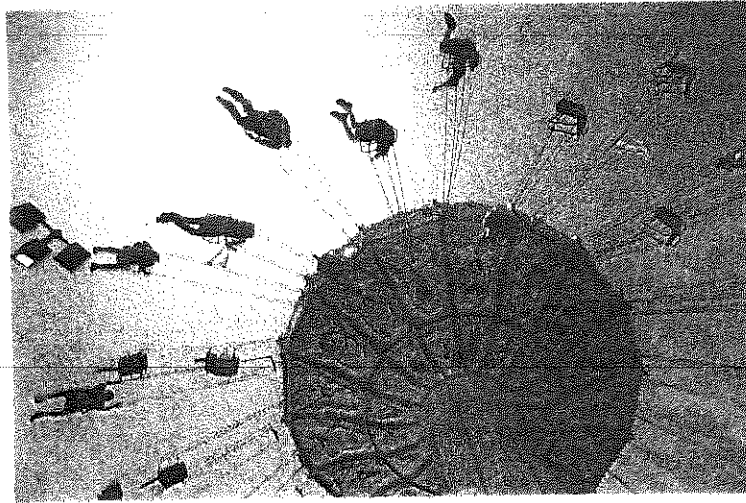
ber of Cardinal Infrastructure, the consulting firm OCTA hired for the street project.

"We fully anticipate that because of the benefits that this project is going to accrue and because of the financial stability behind the financial plan, that the feds will regard this project favorably," said Little, a former deputy and acting administrator of the FTA under the George W. Bush administration.

The FTA in January reviewed the streetcar's ridership projections, finances and benefits and gave it the green light to enter the engineering phase. Earlier in May, congressional leaders identified the streetcar as a project worthy of funding by allocating it \$50 million for this fiscal year.

A contract to build the streetcar, which has 90 percent of its design completed, is scheduled to be awarded in the winter. Service is slated to begin in December 2020.

Sev Miller, counsel for Cardinal Infrastructure and former chief counsel of the FTA, said it was "a pretty remarkable accomplishment" for OCTA to have its project advanced by about a year by the FTA.

Strawberry Festival set for 59th year

Hundreds of thousands of visitors are expected for the annual fundraising celebration in Garden Grove.

What started off as a jubilee to bring different neighborhoods of Garden Grove together would become a celebration to draw hundreds of thousands of visitors decades later.

The 59th annual Garden Grove Strawberry Festival, running Friday through May 29 at the

Village Green between Main Street and Euclid Avenue in Garden Grove, will hold live musical performances, games, contests and rides while also raising money for local charities.

Since the first festival in 1958, the event has raised more than \$6 million for charities benefiting children's nonprofits, homeless and abuse shelters and other organizations, according to a release.

Earnings from the festival, which is considered a nonprofit organization, also have gone to projects in the city, such as the children's wing of the central library, amphitheater seating and

a building for the Garden Grove Boys and Girls Club.

Last year's festival opened its gates to more than 300,000 visitors.

The inaugural Strawberry Festival was organized by the Garden Grove Chamber of Commerce to commemorate the area's rich strawberry fields of the time.

The event is now organized by a group of 40 on their board of directors and associates, who select a new president each year to brainstorm the latest theme for the annual festival.

This year's theme involves

superheroes.

"The first things that came to mind were volunteering and philanthropy work," said Strawberry Festival President Laura Neuschafer. "I care a lot about giving and when you're given a lot, you should care about giving who you are. I wanted those people to be recognized."

One of the heroes Neuschafer is determined to acknowledge is THINK Together founder and chief executive Randy Barth, who will be a grand marshal in the festival's May 27 parade alongside Burt Ward, who played Robin in the ABC show "Batman" in the 1960s.

The Strawberry Festival will welcome visitors on the first day with a strawberry cake-cutting ceremony

CARELESS DRIVERS GET EXPENSIVE LESSON DURING POLICE CROSSWALK OPERATION

As part of the City's Accident Reduction Campaign, the Garden Grove Police Department conducted a crosswalk operation on Friday, May 12, at Lemonwood Lane and Garden Grove Boulevard. 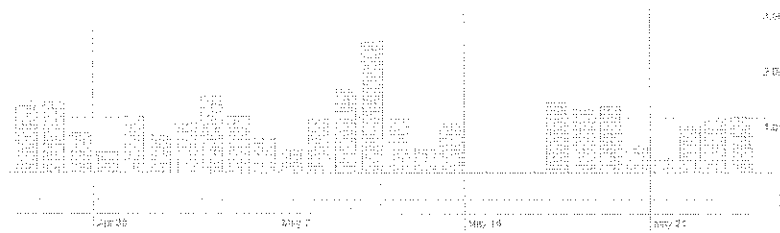

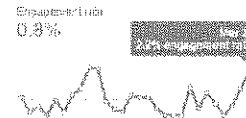

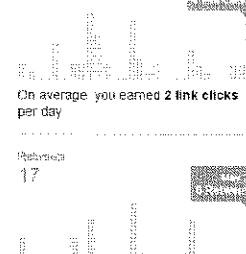

property boundary of any "R" (Residential) zoned property or any PUD established exclusively for residential use; (vi) prohibit crematorium or funeral home/mortuary services or activities for "Cemetery" uses; and (vii) establish minimum parking requirements for "Crematorium", "Crematorium with Incidental Funeral Home/Mortuary", and "Funeral Home/Mortuary with No Crematorium" uses. The project is exempt pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) (It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment).

MATTERS FROM COMMISSIONERS: Vice Chair Brietigam commented that public safety was the primary function of city government and that Garden Grove's Police and Fire Departments were understaffed, especially with Propositions 47, 57, and Assembly Bill 109, and that with the release of prisoners from jails, law enforcement was challenged. His challenge to the City was to hire 200 sworn police officers and five additional fire fighters by the year 2020.

Commissioner Lazenby noted that the Engineering Division responded to his inquiry regarding convention center overflow parking into the adjacent neighborhoods. Staff recommended that residents start a petition for the City to provide signage for no parking in the residential zones.

Commissioner Lehman commented that in the neighborhood off of Katella Avenue, between Gilbert and Brookhurst Streets, the apartment area was blighted with graffiti and discarded items in the street. Staff would have Code Enforcement look into the matter.

Commissioner Truong mentioned that as a runner in west Garden Grove, she encountered broken street pavements, which were dangerous, and also asked if there was a tree plan for the area to buffer increasing exhaust. Staff relayed that Public Works did ongoing street maintenance and the matter would be looked into.

Chair Kanzler asked if the Planning Commission meetings could start at 6:30 p.m. Staff responded that the procedural mechanism would be researched noting that any change would require the adoption of a resolution. Staff then mentioned that 7:00

p.m. was established due to complaints from the public at not having enough time to get to the meetings after work and/or dinner.

Chair Kanzler mentioned that the Power Point presentation was helpful and asked if staff could do more. Staff responded that only the more complex agenda items would warrant presentations.

MATTERS FROM STAFF: Staff stated that the May 4th meeting would be cancelled and that the May 18th meeting would be an Alcoholic Beverage Control Study Session. James Colegrove, the new Police representative for Planning Commission, was introduced.

Task force members reviewed draft materials that outline components and descriptions of homelessness plans and strategies. The information was collected through a review of existing homelessness plans, and can be used by cities and counties to target their work on the issue. They also provided staff with direction on what areas to focus on when collecting best practices in four areas: target populations, collaborative efforts, housing approaches and governance.

In addition to reviewing materials for the report, the task force heard several presentations from state agencies and community partners on available grants and program models.

Representatives from the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) spoke to the committee about what BSCC is doing in the area of homelessness. Recent legislation has required that BSCC include housing of previously incarcerated persons as an issue in their grant guidelines. Specifically, they discussed three BSCC programs that include a housing component:

- MIOCR (Mentally Ill Offender Crime Reduction) — supports prevention, intervention, diversion, supervision, services and strategies aimed at reducing recidivism in California's mentally ill offender population and to improve outcomes for these offenders while continuing to protect public safety.
- Pay for Success — provides funding through Social Innovation Financing for three pilot counties when investors, local government agencies and service providers to agree on outcome goals for programs that reduce recidivism. Repayment on the private investment is based on reaching those targets.
- LEAD (Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion) — improves public safety and reduces recidivism by increasing the availability and use of social service resources while reducing costs to law enforcement agencies and courts stemming from repeated incarceration.

A representative from Alameda County spoke on the Whole Person Care Pilot Program funded by the California Department of Health Care Services. Alameda County's vision is to create a system of whole person care that helps high-need patients achieve optimal independence and health in safe and stable housing. In total, 18 counties are receiving funding from the first round. The task force also had a discussion on data sharing. Since some agencies are not included in HIPAA, there needs to be different levels of access.

The task force will now turn its full attention on preparing the report, which is expected to be published by the end of the year. For more information on the task force and the materials reviewed, please visit the League's [Homelessness Resources](#) webpage.
