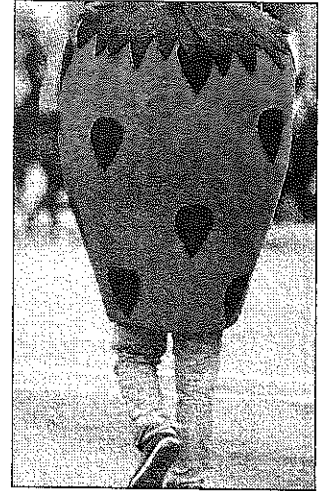

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Political watchdog growls at Garden Grove website

City says it's fixed setup implying illegal hurdle to seeing election records.

GARDEN GROVE • The City Clerk's Office violated a state requirement by making

people submit public records requests before viewing election-related documents, the California agency that monitors political activity has said.

State law allows anybody to view election documents,

such as campaign statements or financial disclosures, by walking into a city clerk's office and asking for them.

But Garden Grove violated that when it "required that a public records request be completed when a request was made for campaign statements," the Fair Political Practices Commission said in a warning letter to City Manager Scott Stiles last month.

Garden Grove officials, though, say the violation was a misunderstanding caused by wording on the city clerk's website.

"We were acting in compliance, but the website made it look like we weren't following the rules," City Clerk Kathy Bailor said. "I understood we made that

mistake, so I wasn't surprised when (the commission) brought that to our attention."

The clerk's office has a binder at the front counter with all of the election documents, which anyone can view when City Hall is open, said Terri Pomeroy, Garden Grove's deputy city clerk.

Those who call or email asking for election forms usually receive them by email the same day - or, at most, the next day if the office is busy, Bailor said.

But the clerk's website used to have a link to a public records request form, sometimes used by the public to get documents an agency is initially declining to turn over. The link was somewhat near where information was provided about

election materials.

The commission, Pomeroy said, thought that the location and the wording were vague and may lead people to think they had to submit requests for election documents. The website now has a line saying election documents are available during regular business hours.

"We're confident the city has taken the steps necessary to alleviate the issue," Jay Wierenga, the commission's spokesman, said. He noted that this type of violation is relatively common.

Several residents who follow the goings-on of Garden Grove and often speak at City Council meetings said they have never had a problem looking at election documents at the clerk's office.

GARDEN GROVE • If you were anywhere near Chapman Avenue and Harbor Boulevard a little before 7 p.m. on Tuesday, and maybe even if you weren't, you probably heard it.

A battalion of trumpet players had gathered behind the Hyatt Regency Orange County in an attempt to break

the record for number of trumpeters playing a fanfare. When none other than Doc Severinsen gave the downbeat, the results weren't subtle.

The event was the opening salvo of the International Trumpet Guild's 41st annual conference, being held at the hotel through Saturday. Trumpeter Richard Birkemeier, chairman of the artist committee, is the man behind the record effort, and when he sent word out that Severinsen, the longtime bandleader on "The Tonight Show," was going to conduct, musicians

arrived in droves.

"Is there still music on the table?" Birkemeier asked the crowd of players as they picked up their parts for rehearsal in the Royal Ballroom. "No," came the answer. Everyone would have to double up.

Severinsen, 88, baton in hand, showed up a few minutes later, dressed as Severinsen of old in a floral shirt, a checkered jacket and jeans.

"If you can live through the warm-up period, the rest of it is a piece of cake," he said.

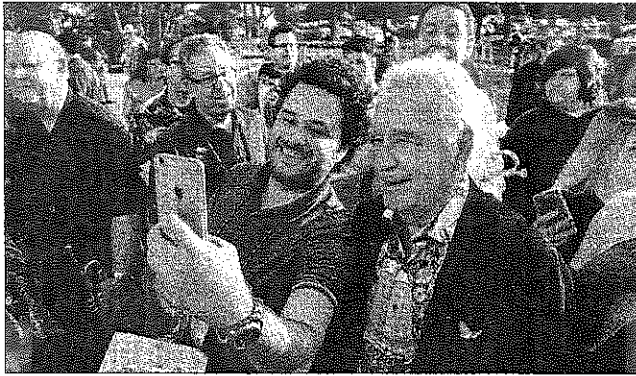
Asked what he would be looking for from the players, he quipped: "I think I'm going to look for the exit."

The piece chosen was the "Olympic Fanfare" by John Williams, written for the 1984 Games in Los Angeles. Birkemeier discovered that the Guinness record for players of a

trumpet fanfare was 105, and he figured that would be easy to beat. Only to make the record official, he said, he would have to pay Guinness \$10,000, money he didn't have.

"We're going to break a record, not set a record," he explained.

Players young and old, professional and amateur, stretched

across the front of the ballroom for the rehearsal, several deep.

"I'm very hopeful that our performance this evening doesn't signal the apocalypse," Birkemeier told them, and then introduced Severinsen to cheers.

"Just use your ears, I'm not going to be much help to you," Severinsen said, and gave the downbeat.

After a single ear-splitting rendition of the familiar tune, Severinsen pro-

nounced himself satisfied and instructions were given to meet outside and to not play in the lobby. Someone counted the players as they exited the ballroom.

Out back, the musicians quickly deployed on the sidewalk, Severinsen with music stand in the driveway before them, hotel employees directing traffic as music blared. The performance that followed wouldn't win any awards, but it was impressive nevertheless.

The final tally? 350 trumpeters had blown.

"Twice what I dreamed of," Birkemeier said.

Fire destroys 5 vehicles, damages 8 in Garden Grove

The carport blaze also affects apartment exteriors.

GARDEN GROVE • A fire Tuesday morning destroyed five vehicles and damaged eight others in an apartment carport.

The fire was reported at 5:29 a.m. and was put out by 6 a.m.

The apartments, in the

8500 block of Gloria Avenue, suffered exterior damage, but flames did not penetrate the buildings, said Capt. Thanh Nguyen of the Garden Grove Fire Department.

Alberto Hernandez, who lives in the complex, said he heard two loud pops.

"I looked out the window and saw an orange glow," he said.

Before Hernandez realized what was happening, he said, a neighbor banged on his door and told him the place was on fire.

Hernandez saw the

flames as they exited the building and called the Fire Department, which told him it already had firefighters en route.

One resident was treated on scene for smoke inhalation but declined ambulance transport to a hospital, Nguyen said.

Garden Grove fire investigators determined the cause to be mechanical failure of a vehicle.

Damage to the structure was estimated at \$125,000, while damage to the vehicles was pegged at \$100,000.

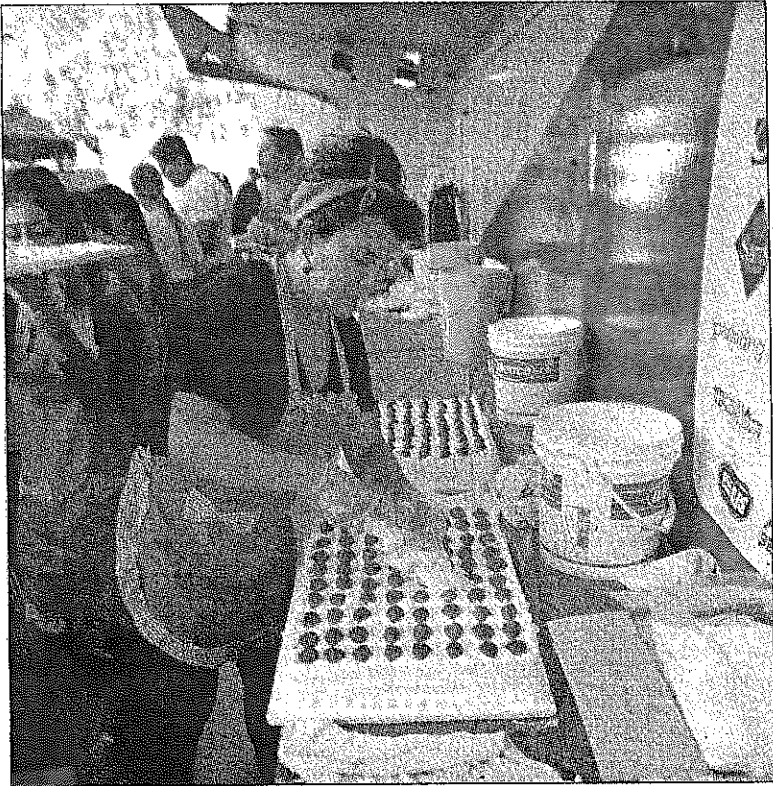

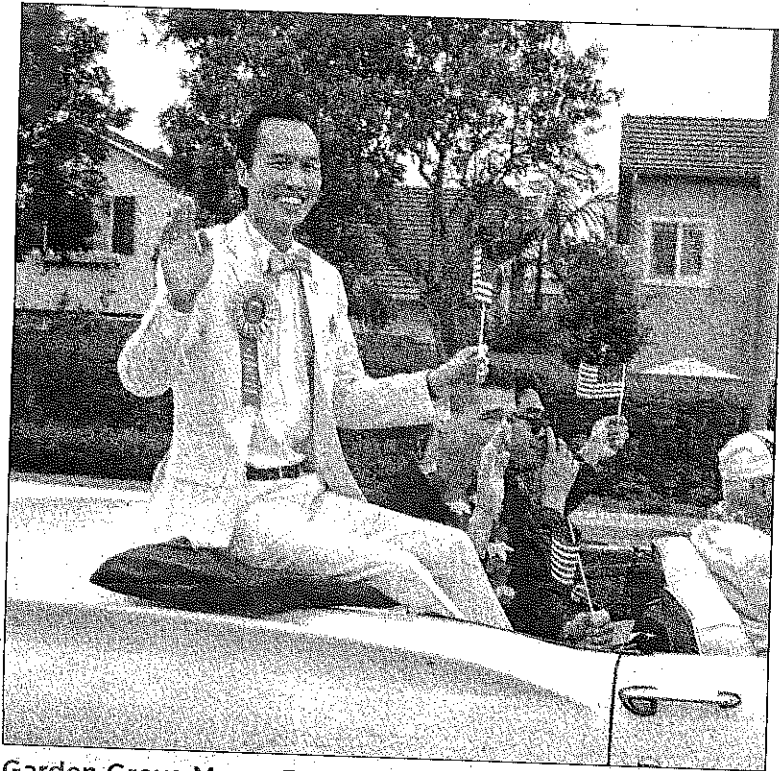

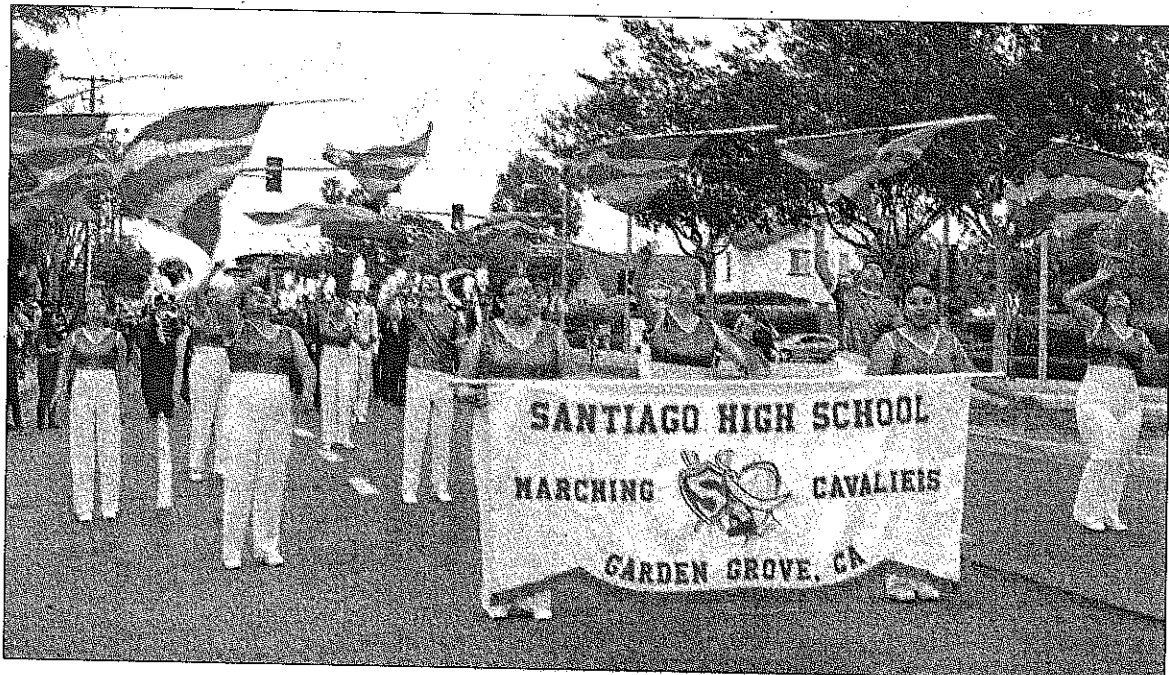

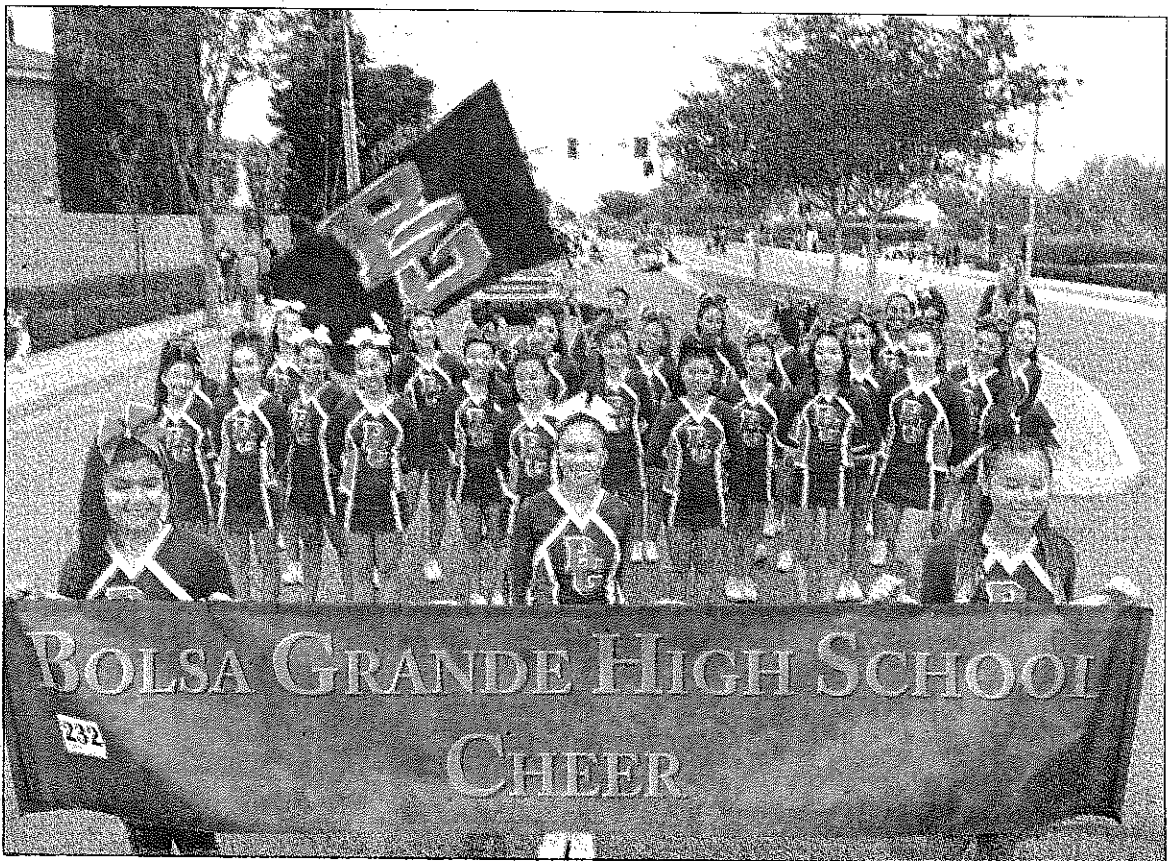

Fire causes \$300,000 in damages to structure

Firefighters were dispatched to a residential structure fire last week.

The first-arriving engine reported heavy smoke and fire showing from a two-story apartment building.

An attack on the fire was made, and a search for residents was also conducted. A primary search

revealed there were no trapped victims. The fire was confined to the original unit involved on the first floor that resulted in extensive damage. The estimated damage to the structure is \$250,000 and \$50,000 to contents. There was no report of injury to residents or firefighters.

Damage to the apartments

prompted a response by the city building department. An inspection of the apartment found three units were determined to be uninhabitable.

The Red Cross responded, and provided assistance to two families, with the third declining. The fire investigation is currently open and under investigation.

Local rep calls state budget a 'blank check'

Assemblyman Travis Allen, who represents Garden Grove, Westminster and other cities, released the following statement last week.

Police chase

Garden Grove police officers were called regarding a possible residential burglary in progress. A witness saw three male, black suspects enter the rear yard of a home on Weldon Drive. The suspects were seen carrying items from the home and left in a silver Infinity sedan just prior to the officer's arrival.

Officers located the suspects in the vehicle in the area of Magnolia Street and Garden Grove Boulevard where the suspects refused to yield. A pursuit ensued where suspects threw out stolen items from the vehicle. The pursuit ended in the area of Beach Boulevard south of the 22 Freeway where two suspects fled on foot and the driver remained in the vehicle.

All the suspects were arrested.

Two of the stolen handguns were thrown out of the vehicle and not located at this time. A shotgun, three watches and a guitar were recovered.

Two of the suspects were on parole for robbery. The suspects were arrested for residential burglary, felony evading, parole violation and felon in possession of a firearm. The suspects have not been interviewed as of yet and as a result no booking photo is available for release.

City Council stands firm on pot ban

The current ban on medical marijuana dispensaries in Garden Grove remains in place while the Medical Marijuana Regulation Task Force, led by Mayor Bao Nguyen and Councilman Phat Bui, continues studying the regulation of medical marijuana businesses in the city.

The task force will also examine the implementation of the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act recently signed into law by Gov. Jerry Brown, taxation authorized by the Act, and solutions to mitigating negative impacts created by illegal marijuana businesses.

The task force, created by the Garden Grove City Council at its March 22 meeting, held public meetings on May 3 and May 18 to hear input from the community and local businesses about medical marijuana dispensaries. More than 300 people in total attended both meetings.

On May 24, the City Council considered taking additional actions regarding taxation and regulation of medical marijuana businesses, but took no action. Instead, the City Council confirmed that the ban against marijuana dispensaries remains in place and the task force will continue to study regulations and the experiences of other jurisdictions permitting medical marijuana businesses and implementing the Act.

Strawberry Festival fun kicks off today

Four-day event will begin by serving free strawberry shortcake

Since 1958, the Garden Grove Strawberry Festival has treated the community to free strawberry shortcake at its grand opening ceremony, this year to be held in the Showmobile today, May 27 at 6 p.m. at Main and Acacia streets in Garden Grove.

The giant cake will be created by French's Pastry Bakery in Costa Mesa. In the past as many as 2,000 have come out for free cake.

Some of the Saturday parade celebrities, who cannot resist having a taste, will be there to say a few words and help pass out cake to the crowd. They include Celebrity Grand Marshal Miss California Bree Morse, Miss Garden Grove

During the four-day Memorial Day weekend event, more than 300,000 annual attendees head for the festival's 200-plus food and commercial booths where they find treasures to buy and all kinds of treats to try. Booths open at 1 p.m. on Friday May 27 and at 10 a.m. on May 28 through May 30.

The 2016 Festival Theme is "Celebrating Our Local Sports Heroes." Fourteen outstanding boy and girl athletes from each of the Garden Grove high schools will ride in the 10 a.m. Saturday parade. This year, 12 charities will be selling food to fill their coffers: Garden Grove's Assistance League, Boys and Girls Club, Emblem Club, High School Band Boosters, High School Baseball

Boosters, Kiwanis Club and Lions Club, in addition to the Guardettes of Orange County, Job's Daughters, Pacifica High School Girls Softball and Shakespeare of Orange County. Collectively, the food booths bring in approximately \$90,000 for their charities.

Offerings include strawberry treats such as strawberry smoothies, cheesecake, crepes, bowls of strawberries with soft ice cream, strawberry sundae, strawberry shortcake, strawberry bread, strawberry royals, tart cups, chocolate covered strawberries and boxes of strawberries. Fairgoers will also find nacho supremes, pizza, chicken wings, hamburgers, cheeseburgers, carne asada, chicken tacos, cheese quesadillas, funnel cakes, baked potatoes, breakfast muffins, corn on the cob, hot dogs, chillitos, BBQ beef sandwiches and popcorn chicken.

La Casa Garcia is donating food for the festival's annual pre-parade breakfast Saturday, May 28 at 7:30 a.m. at the Garden Grove Community Center, 11300 Stanford Ave. Scrambled eggs, pancakes, sausage, ham, a scrambled egg/bacon combo, fried potatoes, plus orange juice and coffee will be served for \$7 per person paid at the door with all proceeds benefiting We Give Thanks, a charity annually providing Thanksgiving dinners for thousands of needy people.

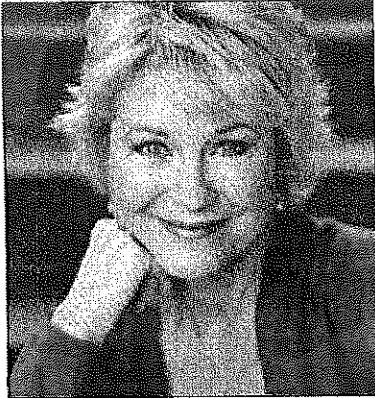

Born into a loving but impoverished family, Deanna Bowers was the bright, beautiful peace-maker of an alcoholic father and a mother who put aside her own dreams in order to support her husband and maintain a happy, stable home. Like so many others who will relate to her childhood, Dee grew up under the push-pull pressure of wanting to perform and make her father proud — and happy enough not to drink — and at the same time remaining quiet and sweet so as not to give family anger a reason to surface.

With welcome clarity and honesty and without a trace of self-pity, she writes about these

experiences as she was growing up, including her father's tragic suicide, and then shows how until examined and reconciled certain issues kept cropping up again and again in her personal and professional life.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE PURSUANT TO THE LANDSCAPING AND LIGHTING ACT OF 1972 (SECTIONS 22500 ET SEQ. OF THE CALIFORNIA STREETS AND HIGHWAYS CODE) DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO LEVY AND COLLECT ASSESSMENTS WITHIN THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE STREET LIGHTING DISTRICT NO. 99-1 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016-17 AND SETTING A TIME AND PLACE FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE LEVY OF THE PROPOSED ASSESSMENTS

The City Council of the City of Garden Grove adopted Resolution

No. 9356-16, initiating proceedings to levy annual assessments for Fiscal Year 2016-17 within the City of Garden Grove Street Lighting District No. 99-1 describing the proposed improvements and ordering the City Engineer to prepare and file a report, pursuant to the provisions of the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, i.e., Division 15, Part 2 (commencing with Section 22500) of the California Streets and Highways Code (herein "Act").

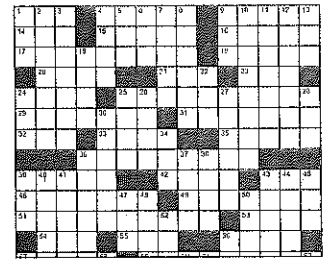

**MARIJUANA BAN REMAINS IN PLACE AS TASK FORCE
CONTINUES REGULATION STUDY**

The current ban on medical marijuana dispensaries in Garden Grove remains in place while the Medical Marijuana Regulation Task Force, led by Mayor Bao Nguyen and Council Member Phat Bui, continues studying the regulation of medical marijuana businesses in the city. The task force will also examine the implementation of the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act ("Act") recently signed into law by Governor Brown, taxation authorized by the Act, and solutions to mitigating negative impacts created by illegal marijuana businesses.

The task force, created by the Garden Grove City Council at its March 22, 2016 meeting, held public meetings on May 3 and May 18, 2016 to hear input from the community and local businesses about medical marijuana dispensaries. Over 300 people in total attended both meetings.

On May 24, 2016 the City Council considered taking additional actions regarding taxation and regulation of medical marijuana businesses, but took no action. Instead, the City Council confirmed that the ban against marijuana dispensaries remains in place and the task force will continue to study regulations and the experiences of other jurisdictions permitting medical marijuana businesses and implementing the Act.

LA PROHIBICIÓN DE MARIHUANA SIGUE VIGENTE MIENTRAS EL GRUPO DE INVESTIGACIÓN CONTINUA EL ESTUDIO DE SU REGULACIÓN

La actual prohibición de dispensarios de marihuana medicinal en Garden Grove permanece en pie mientras que el grupo de investigación de regulación de la marihuana médica (Medical Marijuana Regulation Task Force), encabezada por el alcalde Bao Nguyen y el miembro del Consejo Phat Bui, continúa el estudio de la regulación de los negocios de marihuana medicinal en la ciudad. El grupo de trabajo también examinará la implementación del Acta del Reglamento y Seguridad de la Marihuana Medicinal (Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act) recientemente promulgada por el gobernador Brown, impuestos autorizados por la Acta, y las soluciones para mitigar los efectos negativos creados por las empresas de marihuana ilegales.

El grupo de investigación, creado por el Consejo de la Ciudad de Garden Grove en su reunión del 22 de marzo del 2016, mantuvo reuniones públicas el 3 de mayo y 18 de mayo del 2016 para escuchar las aportaciones de la comunidad y las empresas locales sobre los dispensarios de marihuana medicinal. Más de 300 personas en total asistieron a ambas reuniones.

El 24 de mayo del 2016, el Consejo de la Ciudad consideró la adopción de medidas adicionales con respecto a los impuestos y la regulación de las empresas de marihuana medicinal, pero no tomó ninguna acción. En lugar de ello, el Consejo de la Ciudad confirmó que la prohibición contra los dispensarios de marihuana seguirá vigente y el grupo de trabajo continuará estudiando los reglamentos y las experiencias de otras jurisdicciones que permiten negocios de marihuana médica y de aplicación de la Acta.

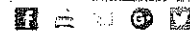

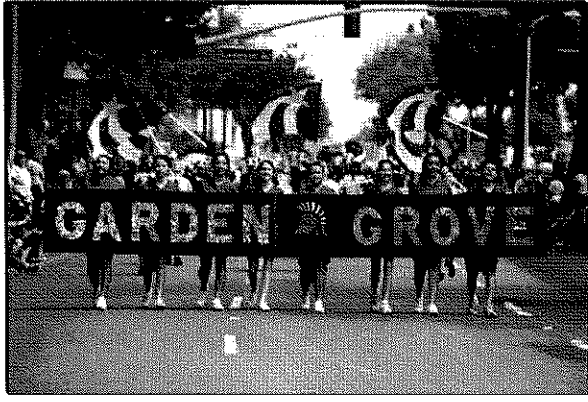



While this action is simply a procedural action, it raises concerns about the timing of a vote on a funding reform package for transportation. The Special Session has not been active since Oct. 21, 2015, when the conference committee met for an informational hearing on California's Transportation Funding Challenge. Much has changed in the legislature since October, and there are several procedural actions that need to take place before the Special Session Conference Committee reconvenes.

In addition, Assembly Budget Committee Chair Phil Ting tweeted on Tuesday following the Assembly Budget Subcommittee #3's vote: "We have been working on transportation funding for over a year. Overall I support the Governor's proposal and, although it has a lot of support in the Legislature, it doesn't have the votes to pass by June 15. By moving it to the policy process, we can keep these important discussions moving forward."

As of today, Senate and Assembly leadership has not revealed a timeline to restart the Special Session. Next week the Fix Our Roads Coalition, of which the League is a member, will send a letter to legislative leadership encouraging them to reenergize the Special Session Conference Committee quickly. California's transportation funding shortfall continues to grow each day the legislature delays action, and it has become too easy for the legislature to push transportation needs to the back of the line of issues to address.

The new regulation will take effect in June 2016 and remain in effect until January 2017, replacing the Feb. 2 emergency water conservation regulation that set specific water conservation benchmarks at the state level for each urban water supplier.

The Water Board changed tactics in response both to improved drought conditions in Northern California and calls from water agencies, the League of California Cities[®] and others to better account for disparate local conditions and challenges.

Rather than its prior percentage-based water conservation targets for each agency, the Water Board pivoted to what it calls a "stress-test" approach. It requires that agencies ensure a three-year supply of water.

If the state faces drought conditions like those from 2012 to 2015, agencies that fall short of a three-year supply will be required to meet a conservation standard equal to the shortage. For example, if an agency is 12 percent short of a three-year supply, it would need to save 12 percent.

The Water Board will set the new standards using information provided by wholesale suppliers about how regional supplies would hold up under three more dry years. In doing so, the board plans to account for groundwater and stormwater as well as imported, recycled and desalinated water.

The Water Board will release the calculations and projections to the public and requires urban water suppliers to continue monthly reporting.

On May 9, Gov. Jerry Brown issued an executive order making permanent some emergency prohibitions intended to reduce the wasting of potable water. These include irrigating ornament turf in medians; hosing off sidewalks, driveways and hardscapes; washing cars with hoses that lack a shut-off nozzle; using non-recirculated water in a fountain or water feature; watering lawns within 48 hours of a measurable rainfall; and overwatering lawns to the point of causing runoff.

The Governor's order includes other long-term steps to reduce water system leaks, strengthen drought resilience and improve both agricultural water use and drought planning.

The Water Board also voted to keep other emergency steps in place, like not serving drinking water other than upon request at restaurants, bars, hotels and other public places and giving hotel guests the option of not having towels and linens laundered daily. Commercial, industrial

and institutional properties will be required to limit outdoor watering with potable water to no more than two days per week.

The Water Board Chair Felicia Marcus warned in a press release that drought conditions are “far from over.” Parts of Northern California and all of Southern California remain at below-average precipitation, groundwater levels remain near historic lows in parts of the San Joaquin Valley and the statewide snowpack stands at 89 percent.

“We’ve moved to a ‘show us the water’ approach, that allows local agencies to demonstrate that they are prepared for three more lousy water years,” Marcus said. “This reporting will show us what agencies plan to do, and how they do, throughout the year. Trust, but verify.

“In the meantime, we’ll be watching and prepared to come back with the 25 percent state mandate early next year if necessary, which we hope it won’t be.”

Winter rains have also helped boost reservoir conditions in Northern California, particularly at Shasta Reservoir (92 percent of capacity as of May 18), Lake Oroville (94 percent) and Folsom Lake (86 percent). Most other reservoirs remain under 61 percent capacity.

On May 19, the U.S. Drought Monitor reported that 42.9 percent of California remains in extreme drought, down from 61 percent in February. A full 94.5 percent of the state remains abnormally dry, however.

In March, Californians doubled their February savings, conserving 24.3 percent compared to March 2013. From June 2015 to March 2016, Californians saved 422.2 billion gallons of water.

Since the 1980s, the Fullerton Police Department has had a long history of working to address the complex needs of the homeless population. Fullerton is known to have the largest homeless population in Orange County yet the department did not have the resources and training available to handle this population. In 2012, the police department partnered with Coast to Coast Foundation, a Yorba Linda-based nonprofit homeless support group, to expand its services and support local homeless residents, feed the hungry, clothe the poor, and provide real solutions to long-term complex issues to those struggling with housing.

Homelessness around the downtown area, specifically around the transportation center, has increased in recent years creating a perception of increased crime. Some of the crimes associated with policing a homeless population include panhandling, littering, urinating and defecating in public, drug use and theft. Equally challenging is recognizing and understanding mental health issues among the homeless population, and how to link the homeless to various resources. Residents, business owners and commuters expect the police department to effectively deal with the homeless population to prevent crime and promote safety. Each day, Fullerton’s officers engage in creative problem solving to meet these expectations, while considering the rights and welfare of the homeless.

In the summer of 2012, the police chief implemented a creative strategy to increase the number of assigned homeless liaison program full-time officers from one to four, and allocated \$50,000.00 to support the program. The homeless liaison officers utilize these funds to provide food, clothing, shelter, transportation and medical care to those in need.

Policing a growing population of homeless takes true care and compassion on the part of the officers. Because of the frequency of these types of calls and the amount of time they take to complete, the department was interested in learning more about the origin of the cause. Very often these cases related to mental illness and lack of trust for the police officers and others. To help address this issue, a Coast to Coast volunteer regularly rides with the department’s homeless liaison officers to offer immediate and onsite assistance with subsistence, shelter and gift cards for food items.

Collaboration between the Coast to Coast Foundation and the Fullerton Police Department is the first of its kind wherein a municipality has pledged time, money and resources to work in conjunction with a local nonprofit run by volunteers and funded by donations. Several neighboring police departments have recently inquired about the program for their own communities, including Los Angeles, Buena Park and Garden Grove.

The Fullerton Police Department has assisted surrounding agencies including the Anaheim and Huntington Beach Police Departments with the particulars and logistics of creating a robust wrap services program in their city to care for their homeless.

The Fullerton Police Department also teamed up with Orange County Mental Health Services to offer a mental health clinician to work with officers and volunteers to provide homeless individuals with immediate mental health assistance and care. The department and county mental health together have provided assistance to more than 1,530 individuals in need of onsite mental health services.

The combined efforts of the department and nonprofit resulted in over 2,000 homeless men, women and children receiving bus passes, food gift cards, food, water, socks, clothing, sleeping bags, relocation assistance funding, hotel vouchers, backpacks, bicycles, payment of California DMV fees for identification cards, assistance with mail stops, and long-term shelter. Additionally, a total of 115 men, women and children have been relocated to permanent long-term housing thanks to the work of all entities working in partnership to end homelessness.
